

SPILL CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR Fielder's Choice Enterprises, Inc.

This Contingency Plan outlines the reporting requirements and immediate actions to be taken by Fielder's Choice Enterprises, Inc. (FCE) in the event a spill, discharge or other release of fuels, lubricants, hydraulic fluids, or other hazardous materials should occur on this project. This plan serves as a guide to insure that the proper notifications are made and that the proper steps are taken to isolate and contain the spilled material and insure it's subsequent clean up. The guidelines presented in this document are in accordance with applicable state and federal regulations.

In the event of a spill, the Safety Officer, Chris Desper should be notified immediately. The Safety Officer along with the Project Superintendent will determine as quickly as possible if the spill can be controlled with resources available on site or if an emergency response spill contractor will be needed. The Safety Officer will also be responsible for making the required notifications to Federal, State and Local agencies. If Chris Desper is not available, the Senior Project Manager, Chad Ratkovich or his designee, will make the required notifications.

Spills of material in excess of 100 gallon or spills to waterways will require the use of an emergency response spill contractor. The Spill Contractor for this project will be GEC Environmental.

If FCE or its subcontractors decide to clean up the spill, every effort will be made to minimize the effect on the environment. This will include isolating the affected area to prevent contamination from entering waterways, wetlands and any other sensitive areas. FCE will use all available resources needed to clean up spills. Resources that will be available on site for spill remediation include:

- Petroleum absorbent pads.
- Loose absorbent materials such as "Oil-Dry" or "Stay-Dry".
- Earth-moving equipment that can be used to build containment, collection or diversion dike.
- Etc, etc.

Fielder's Choice Enterprises, Inc. (FCE) and its subcontractors will have 1 above ground storage tanks (AST) containing diesel fuel. These tanks will be used to refuel construction equipment located on the project. The capacity of the ASTs will be:

- 1 – 2,000 gallon AST

All ASTs on this project will have double-wall construction or will be placed within an earthen dike. The interstitial space on all double-wall tanks will be inspected for leaks at least once a month. Earthen dikes will be constructed of impermeable clay and be

capable of containing a volume of at least 110% of the capacity of the AST and will be inspected after each rainfall event and at least once monthly. ASTs will be placed in a location that will minimize the potential to affect state waters or wetlands should a spill occur. The planned location of ASTs is shown on the drawing provided as attachment A.

Petroleum absorbent pads will be stored on site and used to contain and clean up small amounts of diesel fuel that may be spilled or while fueling equipment.

Training:

The Superintendent, Foremen, Equipment Operators, Fuel Truck Driver, and Mechanics will be trained in the proper handling, transfer and storage of fuels and other substances that could be harmful to the environment. Employees responsible for fueling vehicles or handling petroleum fuels, lubricants or other chemicals will also be informed of the location of spill containment equipment and the procedures to follow should a spill occur. The emergency contact numbers listed below will be kept at the project office trailer in a visible location.
